THE YEAR IN PERSPECTIVE

As we look back several months to those first days of September and the start of school, we realize that many exciting and interesting things have already happened this year in the Music Department, and we eagerly anticipate the events of April and May.

As always, the year begins with the busy activities of the "Marching Falcons". We look back with pride at having received another first place finish at the Marietta Band-O-Rama, the band's sixth in nine years participation. We were disappointed, yet pleased with our second place finish in the Pickerington Marching Festival, one point from first place. At the Athens Contest, things did not work out as we hoped, but in the band's moment of defeat, we were pleased that the Majorettes, Falconettes, and Rifle Corps came home with the Best Overall trophies for their special areas.

In addition to our contest appearances, the "Marching Falcons" performed for all home and away football games, the Millersport Sweet Corn Festival, The Columbus Day USA Parade, and another rousing performance at the Fairfield County Fair.

The marching season came to a close in 1976 with the "Marching Falcons In Concert" and the annual Marching Band Banquet. Two members were selected to share the coveted Outstanding Marching Band Member, Sally Lemert and Randy Hass. Brad Benadum, Mike Smeck, Kitty Page, and Kevin Smith were selected as runners-up from their respective classes.

As we conclude our annual winter concert this evening, our attention will focus on the coming events of the warmer months, and everyone is excited about the "Marching Falcons'" third trip to Washington, D. C., for the National Cherry Blossom Festival Parade. One Hundred thirty-two band members will participate, and will be accompanied by nearly one hundred sixty parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, and friends. Seven Greyhound busses have been chartered to transport this large group, the largest that has ever traveled with the band. Two days of sightseeing will be enjoyed by all, and the highlight of the trip will be the Cherry Blossom Festival Parade, Saturday morning, which will be followed by an afternoon touring the Smithsonian Institute. As we spend the next few weeks in preparation, and as our anxiety and excitement builds, we want not to forget those that make this trip possible. The "Marching Falcons" thank Mr. Chris Williams, Columbus, for his gift which makes our transportation to Washington possible, to the school administration, and teachers for their support and cooperation, and especially to the Music Boosters, whose support is always present and appreciated.

We welcome you to our annual instrumental concert and hope that you enjoy our program.
