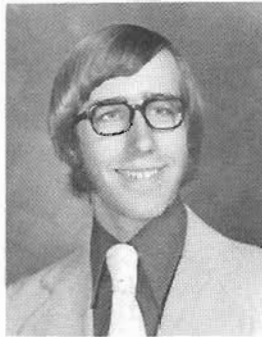
Seniors

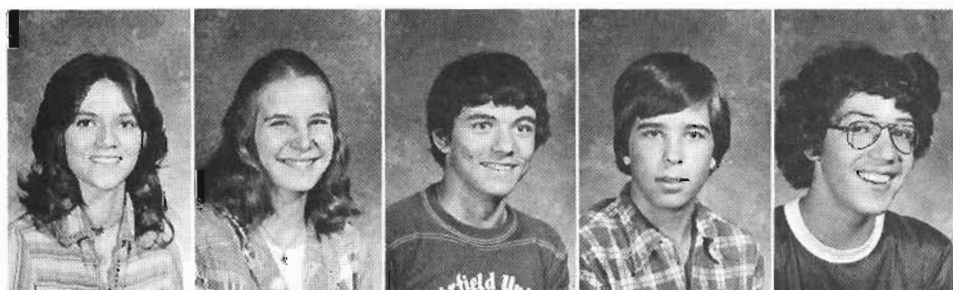
Juniors

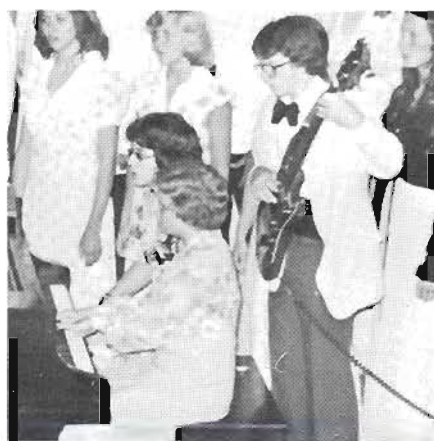
This year singers at Fairfield Union rewrote the record books, with excellent performances by both the Chorus and Assembly Singers, and new activities that kept both groups busy all year long. Beginning in the fall, the Assembly Singers performed twice in October for teacher workshops, and both the Assembly Singers and Chorus took part in the Bloom Carroll Choral Festival, along with Capital University's Men's Glee Club. The Assembly Singers performed over twenty times for school assembly programs in our school and other neighboring school districts, for banquets, conventions, and a variety of affairs. In addition, the Singers produced a thirty minute special Easter program for WTVN-TV, their twenty-sixth TV appearance, and three different tapes for radio programs during the year. 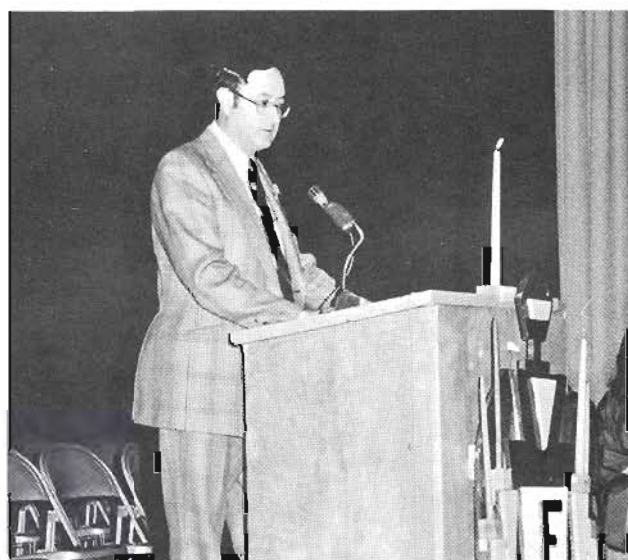

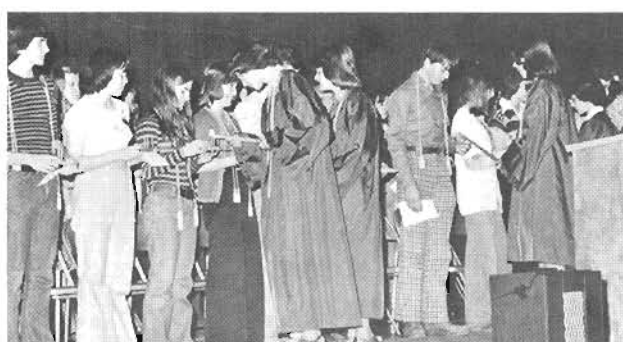
The formal initiation of the new members followed the tapping service. President Boyer administered the pledge and presented each new member with a certificate of membership and the honor society pin.

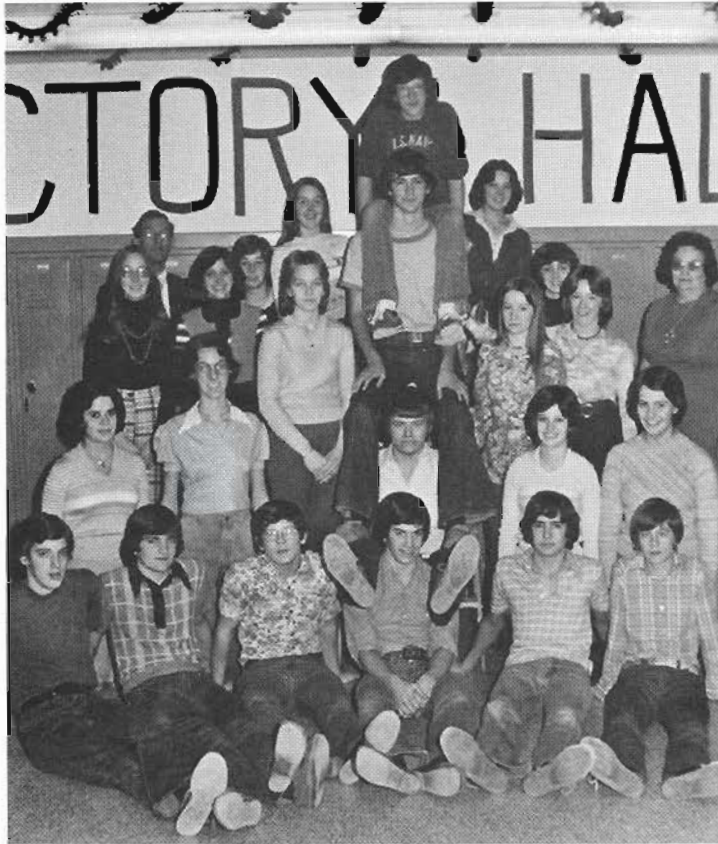
This year's Varsity "F" sponsored lots of activities such as: Lollypop Days, dances, T-shirt sales, etc.

The Falcon Cross-Country team had an excellent season this year with several highlights.

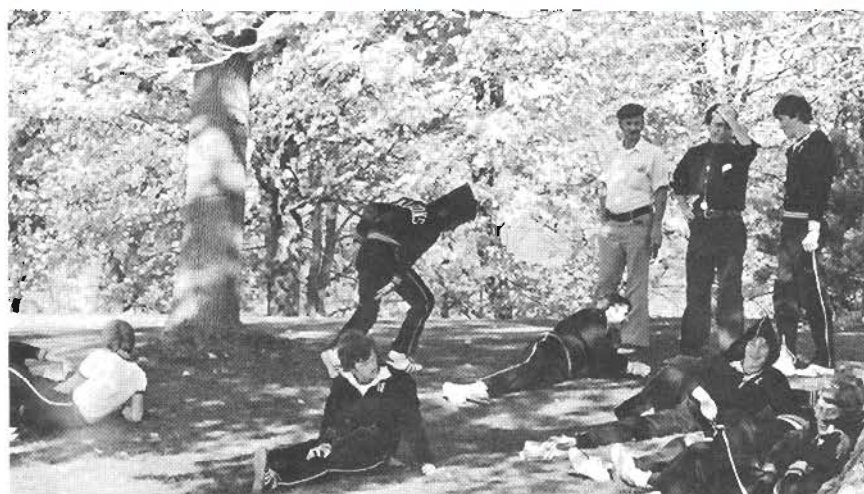

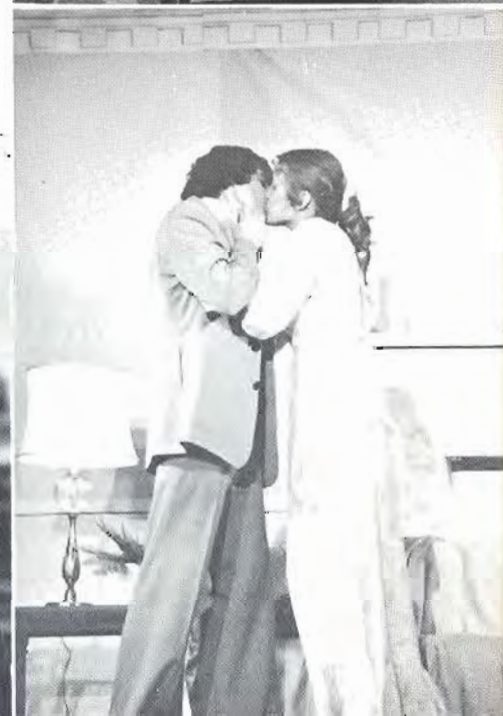
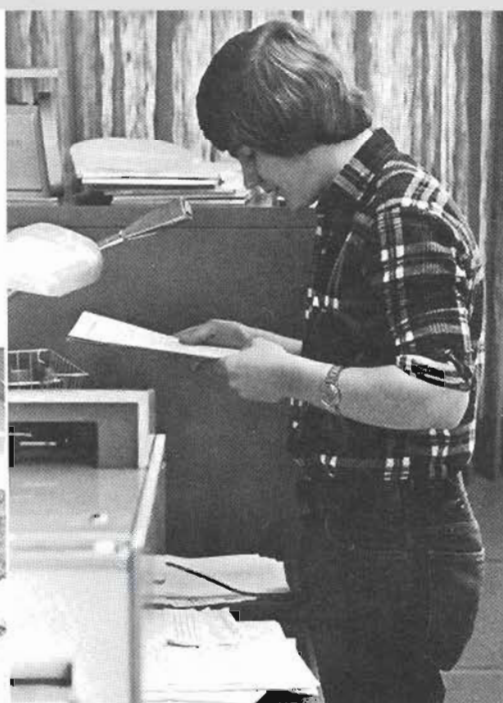


Student Life

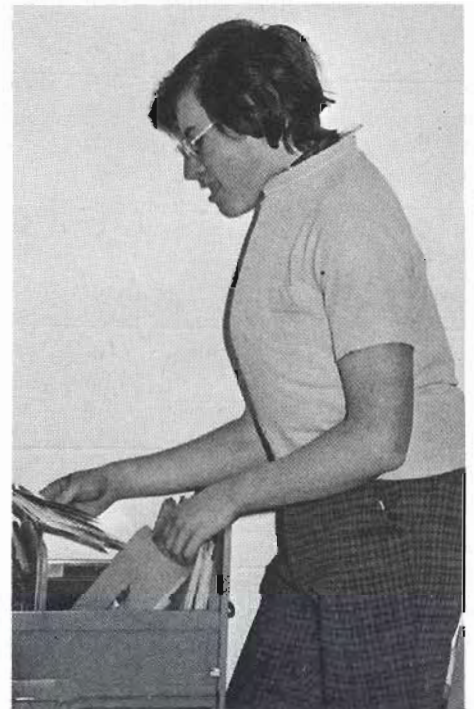


This is your "Basic Bicentennial Yearbook Staff"

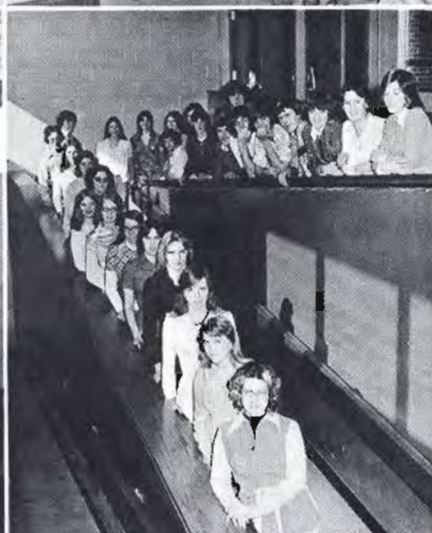


