There you have it, students and friends, a mini-review of the many talents and attributes of our friend, teacher, and leader — Mr. John E. Riley.











































Freshmen


Academics

Choral Music

This year singers at Fairfield Union rewrote the record books, with excellent performances by both the Chorus and Assembly Singers, and new activities that kept both groups busy all year long. Beginning in the fall, the Assembly Singers performed twice in October for teacher workshops, and both the Assembly Singers and Chorus took part in the Bloom Carroll Choral Festival, along with Capital University's Men's Glee Club. The Assembly Singers performed over twenty times for school assembly programs in our school and other neighboring school districts, for banquets, conventions, and a variety of affairs. 



A reception was held in the library immediately following the initiation for the Honor Society members, their parents, and the faculty.



Along with making pillow cases for the Basketball Team, they served breakfast for them twice.










Student Life
























Foreign Exchange Students

doubted the students would beat the faculty. Students lined the football field as they watched some very exciting plays. It was "lets go out to the football field" as the faculty went down to defeat.





































"Could It Be Magic"
